Story of the wine:

Located over the Bassin of Thau and all along the Via Domitia, the vineyard was created in 1330. It was the property of a religious order: the Holy-Spirit order. During the religious wars, monks abandoned their properties. Several families took care of the vineyard but its name was given by François Engarran in 1595 when he became the owner. By the end of religious wars, the monks wanted to get the property back. Then, started a long justice battle between Pierre Engarran and the Holy-Spirit order. In 1611, Pierre Engarran was declared official owner of the vineyard by the Parliament of Toulouse. The vineyard then remained in the Engarran family until 1652. At the beginning of the 19th century, Picpoul started to be well known, vines started growing again. In 1896 and 1897, the Despetis family represented the Langaran vineyard for Picpoul and Clairette. In 1966, the Morin family became the vineyard's owner. Albert, the father, passed on his know-how to his children, who brought a new dynamism to express the fabulous terroir of the estate through wines of great finesse and minerality.

Varietals:

40% Marselan - 60% Merlot

Area:

Languedoc, France

Av. age of the vines:

12-15 years

Ageing:

On Clay and Limestone Soils, the cross grape and merlot are vinified separately. The vatting (traditional) lasts about twenty days on average under temperature control. The wines are then aged in vats for 4 months then bottled.

Descriptions for Wine List:

Fantastic brilliant white mouse upon pour. Pale yellow colour, rightly evanescent, with a fine and persistent perlage. Fresh, white flowers and green apple, velvety palate, well balanced. Strong finish with great acidity, weight and huge drinkability factor.
